PBL "Practice" Projects

Everybody's heard about PBL – Project-Based Learning – and how it is the framework of the education system here at FLA. Some of you may have wondered just when you'd see it in action. Well, we're happy to SCREAM that our first "practice" PBL event kicked off last week in every classroom!

Students across all grades are learning right now how to form a driving question, often including complex associations among and between several different

subject areas, and do their own research to find ways to answer those questions. In the process, they usually generate all kinds of materials to use in presenting their findings in a corporate-style presentation setting.

Why "practice," you ask? It's simple: PBL is a whole new way of doing school for most students, and even for most teachers. The teachers have been through introductory training in PBL, but most of them haven't actually tried teaching that way before

coming to FLA. So this first PBL event is a practice project: practice for the students as they take the first steps to learning the PBL way, and practice for the teachers as they put their training to use for the first time. It's very exciting, but it can also be kind of scary. So encourage your children to hang in there and learn the process while their teachers learn along with them.

This is gonna be GREAT!!

PAA Calls

By now, all parents should have received a call from their child's PAA (Personal Adult Advocate) about his or her academic progress so far. PAAs will be calling every 15 school days with updates on everything from how your child is progressing in Math to how well she or he is socializing with classmates at recess.



Remember that your PAA is your first line of communication with the school, and you should never hesitate to call when you have questions, concerns, or just want to offer a much-needed "Thank You" to an FLA teacher for the great work they do every day with very little praise. And if you haven't yet heard from your PAA, please call Dr. D and let him know.
